In this course, you will be intensely exploring the movements, backgrounds, and emotions of cultures from around the world. The goal, as Maya Angelou once wrote, is to deepen our understanding that “we are more alike, my friends, than we are unlike.”

After reading the required selection, choose one of the Multicultural selections below and read it also. Perform a close reading of each book you choose.

While you read, annotate by underlining or highlighting favorite passages, passages that you believe are important, passages that raise questions, etc. Make notes in the margins about themes, topics, imagery, figurative language, etc. that the author utilizes. If you do not buy these books, but check them out from the library or borrow from someone, you should use Post-it notes for your annotations. Ebooks may be annotated electronically. **You need to bring your annotated texts to class on the first day of the semester.**
